## Genesis Teacher Guide Sample (3,497 KB)

The Genesis sample chapter is from Omnibus I: Biblical and Classical Civilizations. It consists of an introductory worldview essay, followed by five sessions. We would recommend that this chapter be done over one week, which would include reading the Worldview Essay then working through the reading assignments and sessions. For purposes of this curriculum, Genesis is considered a primary book, and thus has five sessions per week. Secondary books have three sessions per week.

The primary books are called just that, primary, because they are of primary importance to the curriculum. The secondary books are of slightly lesser importance and are therefore noted as secondary. We recommend studying one primary book and one secondary book at the same time. In some instances, these books have been chosen to complement each other. There are also times when a harder or "heavier" work has a lighter or easier work chosen to offset it. Keep in mind that working through this material well should satisfy any requirements for the study of history, literature and theology. In fact we actually give a grade for each of those three disciplines at Veritas Academy.

The number of classes included in the Omnibus materials reflects this recommendation. (i.e., a secondary book being covered over two weeks will have six sessions included.) For those interested in more study for any given work, we have included an "extra" session for approximately every five sessions given to a book. So, in the example of the secondary book above, you would find one extra session to use or not use as you see fit.
